RECITALS

- 1. The Basalt Parks, Open Space and Trails (POST) Committee prepared a Master Plan for Parks, Open Space and Trails which was adopted by the Town Council and the Planning and Zoning Commission on October 1, 2013.
- 2. The POST Plan includes recommendations regarding branding Basalt, tying Basalt parks together and providing educational information about Basalt Parks.
- 3. The POST Committee felt that with all of the river and other park planning activities, Chamber Sign Committee efforts, and the need to replace existing park signs that it was timely to prepare a Comprehensive Sign Program for parks, open space and trails in the Town of Basalt.
- 3. The Basalt Town Council approved Resolution No. 25, Series of 2015, approving a contract with Terrain Land Architects to prepare a Comprehensive Sign Program for Basalt Parks, Open Space and Trails.
- 4. The POST Committee has reviewed the materials prepared by Terrain Land Architects and Words Pictures Colours Graphic Design Studio and recommends the Town Council give conceptual approval to the Comprehensive Sign Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Basalt Town Council of Basalt, Colorado, as follows:

Based on the evidence, testimony, exhibits, and comments from the public and Town Staff, the Basalt Town Council hereby approves the Comprehensive Sign Program for Basalt Parks, Open Space and Trails and asks the POST Committee to have the construction details (CAD Installation/Assembly Details) prepared for POST Committee

review and approval. The Sign Plan is to be used by the Town Council and its boards and committees as guidance in approving all park signs in the Town of Basalt. Variations from strict application are permitted as long as the appropriate reviewing authority makes a finding that the revised sign satisfies the objective of the plan to create a cohesive design program that offers a coordinated approach while incorporating some variety so that all Basalt Parks and Trails feel like they are a part of the same system but don't feel like literal duplications of one another.
